Plagiarism Policy

Plagiarism or literary theft is an undesirable practice to be shunned at any cost by any institution. That this encroachment upon other peoples' intellectual domain is unethical and outrageous needn't be overstated.

The college places much value on originality of ideas and individual attempts. To give a fillip to original and systematic research, KTM College makes the supervision and evaluation of the students' projects pretty hard and rigorous at the undergraduate level itself. The projects submitted by the students as part of their undergraduate programs are strictly scrutinized and evaluated and any encroachment upon other peoples' intellectual domain, if detected, is severely dealt with. This helps students to assimilate the 'dos' and 'don'ts' to be followed while preparing projects and theses.

With the up gradation of the department of Arabic as a Research Centre in 2019, the college has taken many measures to detect and check this unsavory practice. The Intellectual Property Cell (IPR Cell) is responsible for ensuring objectivity, impartiality and originality of the research work. The College follows the same methods as practiced by the University of Calicut for checking plagiarism and violation of research ethics. Some of such measures are:

- The College makes use of software to detect the plagiarism in the thesis or project.
- The CD (or such device) containing the soft copy of the doctoral theses /project s has to be in PDF or Word file (or as directed from time to time).
- Research products covering all the chapters, from introduction to bibliography/references shall be in a single file, excluding preliminary pages: declaration, acknowledgement, abstract, list of charts and abbreviations, tables of contents, etc., and succeeding pages: glossary, index, questionnaire, etc.
- In case of the percentage of similar content is beyond the permitted limit or any plagiarized content is detected, the researchers have to take appropriate measures under the supervision of their guides so as to ensure originality of research output.
