## **KTM COLLEGE OF ADVANCED STUDIES ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22**

The KTM College of Advanced Studies, previously known as Darunnajath Arabic College Karuvarakundu, stands as a prominent institution under the administration of Karuvarakundu Darunnajath Islamic Centre (Established in 1976). This educational agency has played a crucial role in transforming the educational and social landscape of the east Malabar region, making significant contributions over the years.

Established in 1986, the college remained as a private, unaided institution till it was affiliated to the university of Calicut and became a grant-in-aid college in 1995. The college which was accorded minority status by the ministry of Minority affairs, Government of India in 2012 holds the unique privilege of being the first ever oriental college to be recognized under 2(f) & 12(b) Act of the UGC in the state of Kerala. The College was converted from the oriental title category to a regular Arts and Science college and renamed as KTM College of Advanced Studies after its founder, the late KT Manumusliyar, in 2017.

Located in a serene and sylvan ambience in Karuvarakundu Gramma Panchayat which lies nestled between the majestic Koomban hills on one side and the verdant Silent Valley on the other, the College is ideally suited for academic and co-academic activities. Being the only higher education institution in this remote, rural village, whose population consists mainly of plantation laborers, small farmers and tribals, the college caters to the higher education needs of the most marginalized sections of the society. The college offers two UG programs, one PG and a doctoral program.

### **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)**

The Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a crucial role in formulating policies and developing strategies to establish and maintain quality assurance within the institution. To achieve this, it brings together the efforts and input of various stakeholders, including the management, principal, staff, Parent-Teacher Association (PTA), Alumni, and most importantly, the students.

Constituted in accordance with the guidelines of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), the IQAC of the College consists of the principal, faculty members, representatives from Non-Teaching Staff (NTS), experts, alumni, students, and members from the local community. By acting as a strong liaison between these different stakeholders, the IQAC sets the course for the college, providing it with the necessary direction and guidance to progress effectively.

During the academic 2021-22, the college conducted many Add-On Courses and certificate programme in different levels. The certificate course in “Multilingual translation” is a forty-

hour add-on course which enables the students to understand the basic translation. For those who complete successfully this certificate programme, the college also provides Diploma and advance diploma courses in the same. Both courses are forty hours. During this academic year, 23 students enrolled for the certificate programme in the multilingual translation and for diploma and advance diploma courses 12 and 8 students also joined respectively. All the students who enrolled for these programs also completed the same.

Ten students have enrolled in the Advanced Diploma Course in Journalism and Correspondence. Additionally, there are three other courses available to students, namely "Arabic for All" with 10 students enrolled, "Business Finance" with 23 students enrolled, and "Academic Speaking and Listening" with 13 students enrolled.
